This week's reading challenges

Aim to read for 5 -10 minutes a day, Monday to Friday. As well as books from home, choose e-books from:

- **Oxford Owl/Active Learn** - use your Active Learn log-in & find **My stuff**.

(W) After you've read a book, choose a reading activity from our list.

This week's writing challenges

- **(S)(W)** Remind yourself of our story, *Where the wild things are*.
- **(S)(W)** Now pretend **you** are one of the wild things! You could do some drama or make a mask or stick puppet to help you get into the role! Next, imagine you've missed Max and have travelled to see him. What is it like there? Then, **plan and write a letter** to a friend or relative on your island to tell them about your trip. Use the planning sheet, word bank and videos to help you. Remember, you will probably need at least 3 writing sessions!
- **(S)** Work on your handwriting - we have sent a sheet of words to practise **really slowly and carefully**.

This week's maths challenges
